





#### Definitions

The word "love" can have a variety of related but distinct meanings in different contexts. Many other languages use multiple words to express some of the different concepts that in English are denoted as "love"; one example is the plurality of Greek words for "love" which includes *agape* and *eros*. [13] Cultural differences in conceptualizing love thus doubly impede the establishment of a universal definition. [14]

Although the nature or essence of love is a subject of frequent debate, different aspects of the word can be clarified by determining what *isn't* love (antonyms of "love"). Love as a general expression of positive sentiment (a stronger form of *like*) is commonly contrasted with hate (or neutral apathy). As a less-sexual and more-emotionally intimate form of romantic attachment, love is commonly contrasted with lust. As an interpersonal relationship with romantic overtones, love is sometimes contrasted with friendship, although the word *love* is often applied to close friendships or platonic love. (Further possible ambiguities come with usages "girlfriend", "boyfriend", "just good friends").

Love often involves caring for, or identifying with, a lll, 1867 by Ford Madox Brown person or thing (cf. vulnerability and care theory of love), including oneself (cf. narcissism). In addition to cross-cultural differences in understanding love, ideas about love have also changed greatly over time. Some historians date modern conceptions of romantic love to courtly Europe during or after the Middle Ages, although the prior existence of romantic attachments is attested by ancient love poetry. The complex and abstract nature of love often reduces discourse of love to a thought-terminating cliché. Several common proverbs regard love, from Virgil's "Love conquers all" to The Beatles' "All You Need Is Love". St. Thomas Aquinas, following Aristotle, defines love as "to will the good of another." [16]

Bertrand Russell describes love as a condition of "absolute value," as opposed to relative value. [citation needed] Philosopher Gottfried Leibniz said that love is "to be delighted by the happiness of another." [17] Meher Baba stated that in love there is a "feeling of unity" and an "active appreciation of the intrinsic worth of the object of love." [18] Biologist Jeremy Griffith defines love as "unconditional selflessness". [19]

Play is a range of intrinsically motivated activities done for recreational pleasure and enjoyment. [1] Play is commonly associated with children and juvenile-level activities, but play occurs at any life stage, and among other higher-functioning animals as well, most notably mammals and birds.

Many prominent researchers in the field of psychology, including Melanie Klein, Jean Piaget, William James, Sigmund Freud, Carl Jung and Lev Vygotsky have erroneously viewed play as confined to the human species, believing play was important for human development and using different research methods to prove their theories.


Play is often interpreted as frivolous; yet the player can be intently focused on their objective, particularly when play is structured and goal-oriented, as in a game. Accordingly, play can range from relaxed, free-spirited and spontaneous through frivolous to planned or even compulsive. [2] Play is not just a pastime activity; it has the potential to serve as an important tool in numerous aspects of daily life for adolescents, adults, and cognitively advanced non-human species (such as primates). Not only does play promote and aid in physical development (such as band-over coordination), but it also aids in cognitive development.





Action Plan for Wikipedia + Libraries Training in Mexico

#### Action Plan for Wikipedia + Libraries Training in Mexico

With support of a project grant from the Wikimedia Foundation, OCLC has investigated potential paths for providing training in Mexico that would prepare library staff to help increase awareness and use of Wikipedia as a reference resource among students and the general public. A summary of OCLC's findings and recommendations are included in this action plan.

#### Research and outreach

From June through October 2019, OCLC engaged the Mexico-based consultants COP | Digital Information Solutions, S.A. de C.V. to conduct (1) an environmental scan of the library field in Mexico and (2) outreach to key library agencies and educational institutions in the country. The primary strategies and activities included the following:

- Attending the Mexico Library Association's (Asociación Mexicana de Bibliotecatios) annual conference, ABMEAC, which is an important wense for professional development and networking for the library workforce. The conference attracts approximately 350 attendess from across Mexico. Several important first contacts were made at the Jazzo 2019 event. This was also an opportunity to observe consist training workshops and to socialize the US-based Wildpudie-Jubraries. Benet Together training course with some of the conference attendess.
- Meeting in person with leadership of government agencies, library networks, universities, state libraries, and schools to (1) show the Wilkgeleal Lealiners: Better Topedre course materials created by OCLC to provide a frame of reference, (2) gauge interest in the topic for Mexico library soff training, and (3) deading organizations that are in a position to create and conduct such training for library staff in Mexico. The key organizations engaged were the following:
  - 1. Dirección General de Bibliotecas (DGB) of Mexico\*
  - Universidad de Guadalajara Library network\*, which includes Biblioteca Pública del Estado de Jalisco "Juan José Arreola" (the Public Library of the State of Jalisco)
  - Escuela Nacional Preparatoria (ENP) of Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM)
  - Escuela Nacional de Biblioteconomía y Archivonomía (ENBA), the national school of library and archival sciences
  - 5. El Colegio de México (COLMEX) Library
  - 6. Universidad Pedagógica Nacional (UPN) Library

In some cases, initial meetings led to follow-up conversations. The organizations followed by an asterisk (\*) are of special interest and are discussed in more detail in the next section. See Appendix A for meeting dates and the personnel involved in those meetings.

Introduction

Andreas Gursky (born January 15, 1955) is a German photographer and Professor at the Kunstakademie Düsseldorf, Germany. He is known for his large format architecture and landscape colour photographs, often employing a high point of view. Gursky shares a studio with Laurenz Berges, Thomas Ruff and Axel Hütte on the Hansaallee, in Düsseldorf. The building, a former electricity station, was transformed into an artists studio and living quarters, in 2001, by architects Herzog & de Meuron, of Tate Modern fame. In 2010-11, the architects worked again on the building, designing a gallery in the basement.
